

Scripture Reflection

Mercy Is the Measure

"Who is my neighbor?" the scholar of the law asks- not to seek truth, but to draw boundaries. Jesus doesn't answer with theory or debate. He answers with a story. A man is beaten and left for dead. Religious leaders pass by, cautious and detached. But a Samaritan- an outsider- stops. He sees. He is moved. And he acts.



Compassion, in the Gospel, is not a feeling- it is a response. Jesus shows us that love for God and love for neighbor are inseparable. The Samaritan doesn't ask, "What will happen to me if I stop?" He asks, in effect, "What will happen to this man if I don't?"

"Go and do likewise," Jesus says (Luke 10:37). This is not just a moral call; it is a divine invitation. The parable stretches our understanding of neighbor beyond comfort, tribe, or convenience. It compels us to cross the road, to step out of self, and to become instruments of mercy.

Moses tells the people in the first reading that God's command is "not too mysterious... It is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts" (Deut 30:14). The law of love is not hidden- it is woven into our very being. We simply need to live it.

In the second reading, Paul reminds us why we can: because all things hold together in Christ (Col 1:17). In Him, we are not only reconciled to God but made part of His body- the Church. We don't love alone. The Spirit within us empowers every act of mercy, great or small.

St. John of the Cross once wrote, "Where there is no love, put love- and you will draw out love." The Samaritan does exactly this. He doesn't assess worthiness. He sees a person in need and becomes neighbor.

Today, let us not merely admire the Samaritan. Let us become him. The road from Jerusalem to Jericho still winds through our neighborhoods, workplaces, and homes. People lie wounded- not always visibly, but deeply.

To follow Christ is to stop, to see, and to serve. That is the mercy that makes us truly human- and truly Christian.

FAQ: Why Should I Register at Saint Benedict Catholic Church?

- 1. A sense of belonging and identity within a parish community.
- 2. It is a commitment to practice your faith.
- 3. Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you, in good times and in bad.
- 4. Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will have a statement for income tax purposes.
- 5. Registered active members are eligible to be sacramental sponsors and godparents.
- 6. Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.
- 7. Children are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. Once they are 18, it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and register as a member independent of their parents.

How Do I Register?

You can register online at the parish website: **www. stbenedict.org**.

Registration forms can be also be found in the parish Narthex in back of the church. Submit your completed form to the parish office, drop it in the collection basket or the office drop box located next to the office.

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

La misericordia es la medida

«¿Quién es mi prójimo?», pregunta el estudioso de la ley, no para buscar la verdad, sino para trazar límites. Jesús no responde con teorías o debates. Responde con una historia. Un hombre es golpeado y dado por muerto. Los líderes religiosos pasan de largo, cautelosos e indiferentes. Pero un samaritano, un forastero, se detiene. Lo ve. Se conmueve. Y actúa.

En el Evangelio, la compasión no es un sentimiento, sino una respuesta. Jesús nos muestra que el amor a Dios y el amor al prójimo son inseparables. El samaritano no pregunta: «¿Qué me pasará si me detengo?». Pregunta, en efecto: «¿Qué le pasará a este hombre si no lo hago?».

«Vete y haz tú lo mismo», le dice Jesús (Lucas 10, 37). No se trata sólo de una llamada moral, sino de una invitación divina. La parábola amplía nuestra comprensión del prójimo más allá de la comodidad, la tribu o la conveniencia. Nos obliga a cruzar el camino, a salir de nosotros mismos y a convertirnos en instrumentos de misericordia.

Moisés dice al pueblo en la primera lectura que el mandato de Dios «no es demasiado misterioso... Es algo muy cercano a vosotros, que ya está en vuestras bocas y en vuestros corazones» (Dt 30,14). La ley del amor no está oculta, está entretejida en nuestro ser. Sólo tenemos que vivirla.

En la segunda lectura, Pablo nos recuerda por qué podemos hacerlo: porque todas las cosas permanecen unidas en Cristo (Col 1,17). En Él, no sólo estamos reconciliados con Dios, sino que formamos parte de su cuerpo: la Iglesia. No amamos solos. El Espíritu que está en nosotros da poder a cada acto de misericordia, grande o pequeño.

San Juan de la Cruz escribió una vez: «Donde no hay amor, pon amor, y sacarás amor». El samaritano hace exactamente esto. No evalúa el valor. Ve a una persona necesitada y se convierte en su prójimo.

Hoy, no nos limitemos a admirar al samaritano. Convirtámonos en él. El camino de Jerusalén a Jericó sigue serpenteando por nuestros barrios, lugares de trabajo y hogares. La gente yace herida, no siempre visiblemente, pero sí profundamente.

Seguir a Cristo es detenerse, ver y servir. Esa es la misericordia que nos hace verdaderamente humanos y verdaderamente cristianos.
