### IF YOU LOVE ME, YOU WILL KEEP MY COMMANDMENTS.



My Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Sixth Sunday of Easter, and in two weeks we shall be celebrating the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles on Pentecost. This is precisely why the Readings at the liturgy this weekend revolve around the effects of the coming of the Holy Spirit on members of the early and post Resurrection Church.

The First Reading narrates the story of the “Samaritan Pentecost,” as the Holy Spirit descended on the much maligned descendants of Northern Israel. After Philip had preached the Good News to the Samaritans with appreciable success, the Apostles in Jerusalem sent Peter and John who prayed and laid hands on them. They received the Holy Spirit through this sacramental ritual. The outpouring of the Spirit of God on the Samaritans was a fulfillment of the prophecies that God would restore the relationship He had with the people of Northern Israel. Recall that after the reign of Solomon, Israel split into two with roughly ten tribes in the North and two tribes in the South. Around 720 BC, the Northern kingdom was destroyed and its inhabitants departed. Those who remained intermarried with Gentiles became known as the Samaritans. They were despised by the Jews in the first century. However, God had promised to “sprinkle clean water” upon the whole of Israel (Ezekiel 36:10) and to put His Spirit within them (Ezekiel 36: 25-27). The coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Samaritans was the direct fulfillment of this Divine promise.

The First Reading also tells the story of the beginnings of the liturgical form of the Sacrament of Confirmation, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in its fullness on the faithful to strengthen and animate them, thereby completing the Sacrament of Baptism. It is instructive that, though the Samaritans had received Baptism from Philip, they did not receive the Holy Spirit in its fullness until Peter and John (the Apostles) laid hands on them and prayed for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit to confirm them.

In the Second Reading, St. Peter encouraged the early Christians who had received the Holy Spirit through Baptism and Confirmation to stand firm, ready to gently explain to others the basis of their hope and faith and to be prepared to be maligned, defamed, and even suffer persecution for their belief.

In the Gospel passage, Jesus makes the keeping of His Commandments the mandatory proof for loving Him and the necessary condition for receiving the Holy Spirit. Through His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, God the Father has made available the gift of His Holy Spirit to all people: Jews, Gentiles, Samaritans, everyone. But this is dependent on one condition: that we believe in His Son and demonstrate that belief by keeping His Commandments. Thus, as we await the coming of the Holy Spirit in two weeks, we are invited to examine our attitude toward the twin Commandments of love of God and love of neighbor. It is only when we love one another, as Christ has loved us, that we can truly hope for a fruitful participation in the outpouring of God’s animating Spirit at Pentecost.

May we be aided by Grace to keep God’s Commandments of love so that we can experience the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

### FAQ: Why Should I Register at Saint Benedict Catholic Church?

1. A sense of belonging and identity within the parish community.
2. It is a commitment to practice your faith.
3. Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you, in good times and in bad.
4. Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will have a statement for income tax purposes.
5. Registered, active members are eligible to be sacramental sponsors and Godparents.
6. Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.
7. Children are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. Once they are 18, it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and register as a member independent of their parents.

## Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

### SI ME AMAS, CUMPLIRÁS MIS MANDAMIENTOS.



Queridos amigos,

Hoy celebramos el sexto domingo de Pascua, y dentro de dos semanas celebraremos la venida del Espíritu Santo sobre los apóstoles en Pentecostés. Precisamente por eso, las lecturas de la liturgia de este fin de semana giran en torno a los efectos que tuvo la venida del Espíritu Santo en los miembros de la Iglesia primitiva y de la Iglesia posterior a la Resurrección.

La primera lectura narra la historia del «Pentecostés samaritano», cuando el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre los tan denostados descendientes de Israel del Norte. Después de que Felipe hubiera predicado la Buena Nueva a los samaritanos con notable éxito, los apóstoles de Jerusalén enviaron a Pedro y a Juan, quienes oraron e impusieron las manos sobre ellos. Estos recibieron el Espíritu Santo a través de este rito sacramental. La efusión del Espíritu de Dios sobre los samaritanos fue el cumplimiento de las profecías según las cuales Dios restablecería la relación que tenía con el pueblo del norte de Israel. Recordemos que, tras el reinado de Salomón, Israel se dividió en dos, con unas diez tribus en el norte y dos tribus en el sur. Alrededor del año 720 a. C., el reino del norte fue destruido y sus habitantes se marcharon. Los que se quedaron y se casaron con gentiles pasaron a ser conocidos como samaritanos. En el siglo I eran despreciados por los judíos. Sin embargo, Dios había prometido «rociar agua limpia» sobre todo Israel (Ezequiel 36:10) y poner Su Espíritu en ellos (Ezequiel 36:25-27). La venida del Espíritu Santo sobre los samaritanos fue el cumplimiento directo de esta promesa divina.

La primera lectura narra también los orígenes de la forma litúrgica del sacramento de la Confirmación, el derramamiento del Espíritu Santo en toda su plenitud sobre los fieles para fortalecerlos y animarlos, completando así el sacramento del Bautismo. Es instructivo que, aunque los samaritanos habían recibido el Bautismo de Felipe, no recibieron el Espíritu Santo en su plenitud hasta que Pedro y Juan (los apóstoles) les impusieron las manos y oraron para que el Espíritu Santo se derramara sobre ellos y los confirmara.

En la segunda lectura, San Pedro animó a los primeros cristianos, que habían recibido el Espíritu Santo a través del Bautismo y la Confirmación, a mantenerse firmes, dispuestos a explicar con amabilidad a los demás el fundamento de su esperanza y su fe, y preparados para ser calumniados, difamados e incluso sufrir persecución por sus creencias.

En el pasaje del Evangelio, Jesús establece que el cumplimiento de sus mandamientos es la prueba indispensable del amor hacia Él y la condición necesaria para recibir el Espíritu Santo. A través de su Hijo, nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Dios Padre ha puesto al alcance de todos el don de su Espíritu Santo: judíos, gentiles, samaritanos, todos. Pero esto depende de una condición: que creamos en su Hijo y demostremos esa fe mediante el cumplimiento de sus mandamientos. Así pues, mientras esperamos la venida del Espíritu Santo dentro de dos semanas, se nos invita a examinar nuestra actitud hacia los dos mandamientos del amor a Dios y del amor al prójimo. Solo cuando nos amamos los unos a los otros, tal y como Cristo nos ha amado, podemos esperar verdaderamente participar de forma fructífera en la efusión del Espíritu vivificante de Dios en Pentecostés.

Que la Gracia nos ayude a cumplir los mandamientos de amor de Dios, para que podamos experimentar el derramamiento del Espíritu Santo en Pentecostés.

Por favor, tened amabilidad y que Dios os bendiga.

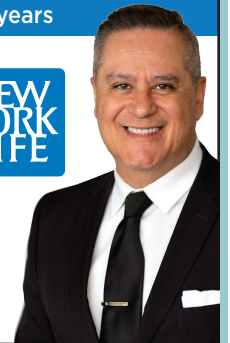
