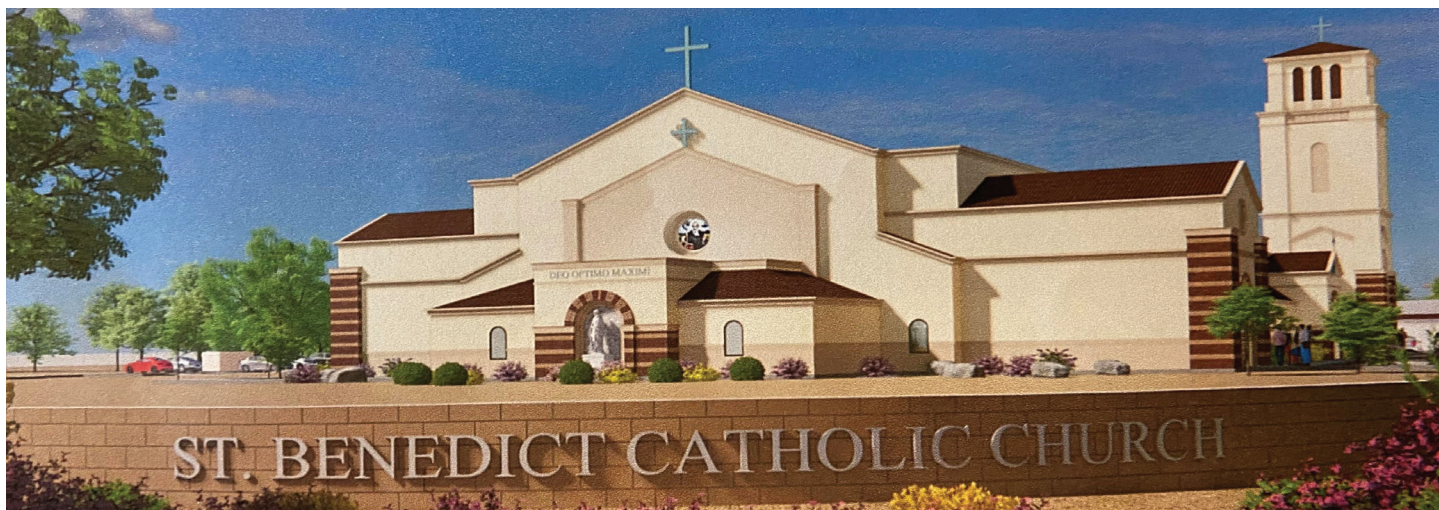

Gospel Reflection

THE GOD WHO SATISFIES THE DEEPEST HUNGER OF THE HUMAN HEART



Dear Friends In Christ,

The readings of this Sunday reveal a profound truth about nature and grace: every living creature hungers. Birds search for food at dawn, rivers flow endlessly toward the sea, and roots stretch deep into the earth in search of water. Yet, despite all these natural instincts, only the human person hungers not only with the body but also with the soul. God created us with this deeper hunger so that nothing less than Him would completely satisfy us.

The Prophet Isaiah asks in the first reading (Isaiah 55:2): *"Why spend your money for what is not bread, and your labour for what does not satisfy?"* This is more than a question about food or wealth. It is God's invitation to examine the desires of our hearts and what we long for. Just as seawater can never quench thirst but increases it, worldly pleasures, power, wealth, and recognition can never satisfy the deepest longing of the human soul. They may entertain us for a moment, but they cannot give lasting peace. This is because every human heart is created with an infinite desire that only the Infinite God can fill. Isaiah invites us to nourish the soul which is giving ourselves to God and allowing him to fill the emptiness in our hearts with His love, peace, and grace and seeking God through prayer, His words and the sacraments.

St. Paul teaches us in the second reading that nothing can separate us from the unfailing love of God in Christ not even suffering, difficulties, human struggles, pain or depression. God's love is stronger than every challenge we face and gives us courage, hope, and inner strength. Anyone who trusts in God's love can remain faithful and confident even in times of hardship. The power of God's love cannot be measured. When we feel unworthy he still loves us.

In the Gospel reading, God multiplies what is surrendered, not what is hidden (Matthew 14:17-20). When Jesus fed the five thousand, He did not begin with abundance. He began with five loaves and two fish, a meal too small by human calculation. Once we place our little faith, strength, hope and trust into His hands, He multiplies sufficient for us and for everyone. Nature quietly teaches the same lesson. A tiny seed disappears into the soil before it becomes a mighty tree. If the seed refuses to be buried, it never bears fruit. Likewise, gifts, talents, resources, and even our suffering become fruitful only when surrendered to God.

The miracle was not merely the multiplication of bread; it was the transformation of generous hearts. God continues to feed the world through people who willingly place their little resources at His service. St. John Chrysostom reminds us: *"If you cannot find Christ in the beggar at the church door, you will not find Him in the chalice."* Our love for Christ is measured by our willingness to become bread for others through generosity, compassion, and self-giving. The God who satisfies every living creature, is the same God who leaves us in our brokenness. When we seek Him above all things and entrust Him with the little we possess, He transforms our emptiness into abundance and our weakness into blessing.

May the Holy Eucharist deepen our hunger for God, who alone satisfies every human heart, and may we become bread broken and shared for a hungry world. Amen.

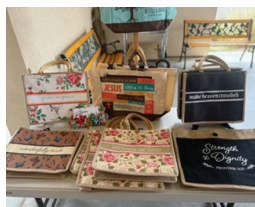

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

EL DIOS QUE SACIA LA HAMBRE MÁS PROFUNDA DEL CORAZÓN HUMANO



Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Las lecturas de este domingo revelan una profunda verdad sobre la naturaleza y la gracia: toda criatura viva tiene hambre. Las aves buscan alimento al amanecer, los ríos fluyen sin cesar hacia el mar y las raíces se adentran profundamente en la tierra en busca de agua. Sin embargo, a pesar de todos estos instintos naturales, solo el ser humano tiene hambre no solo con el cuerpo, sino también con el alma. Dios nos creó con esta hambre más profunda para que nada menos que Él pudiera satisfacernos plenamente.

El profeta Isaías pregunta en la primera lectura (Isaías 55, 2): «¿Por qué gastáis vuestro dinero en lo que no es pan, y vuestro esfuerzo en lo que no sacia?». Se trata de algo más que una pregunta sobre la comida o la riqueza. Es una invitación de Dios a examinar los deseos de nuestro corazón y aquello que anhelamos. Al igual que el agua del mar nunca puede saciar la sed, sino que la aumenta, los placeres mundanos, el poder, la riqueza y el reconocimiento nunca pueden satisfacer el anhelo más profundo del alma humana. Puede que nos entretengan por un momento, pero no pueden darnos una paz duradera. Esto se debe a que cada corazón humano ha sido creado con un deseo infinito que solo el Dios Infinito puede colmar. Isaías nos invita a nutrir el alma, lo cual significa entregarnos a Dios y permitirle que llene el vacío de nuestro corazón con Su amor, Su paz y Su gracia, y buscar a Dios a través de la oración, Sus palabras y los sacramentos.

San Pablo nos enseña en la segunda lectura que nada puede separarnos del amor inquebrantable de Dios en Cristo, ni siquiera el sufrimiento, las dificultades, las luchas humanas, el dolor o la depresión. El amor de Dios es más fuerte que cualquier desafío al que nos enfrentemos y nos da valor, esperanza y fuerza interior. Cualquiera que confíe en el amor de Dios puede mantenerse fiel y seguro incluso en tiempos de adversidad. El poder del amor de Dios es inconmensurable. Aunque nos sintamos indignos, Él sigue amándonos.

En la lectura del Evangelio, Dios multiplica lo que se le entrega, no lo que se oculta (Mateo 14, 17-20). Cuando Jesús alimentó a los cinco mil, no partió de la abundancia. Partió de cinco panes y dos peces, una comida demasiado escasa según los cálculos humanos. Cuando ponemos nuestra pequeña fe, nuestras fuerzas, nuestra esperanza y nuestra confianza en Sus manos, Él multiplica lo suficiente para nosotros y para todos. La naturaleza nos enseña en silencio la misma lección. Una diminuta semilla desaparece en la tierra antes de convertirse en un árbol imponente. Si la semilla se niega a ser enterrada, nunca da fruto. Del mismo modo, los dones, los talentos, los recursos e incluso nuestro sufrimiento solo dan fruto cuando los entregamos a Dios.

El milagro no fue solo la multiplicación del pan; fue la transformación de los corazones generosos. Dios sigue alimentando al mundo a través de personas que ponen de buen grado sus escasos recursos a su servicio. San Juan Crisóstomo nos recuerda: «Si no puedes encontrar a Cristo en el mendigo que está a la puerta de la iglesia, tampoco lo encontrarás en el cáliz». Nuestro amor por Cristo se mide por nuestra disposición a convertirnos en pan para los demás a través de la generosidad, la compasión y la entrega. El Dios que sacia a toda criatura viviente es el mismo Dios que nos acepta tal y como somos, con nuestras imperfecciones. Cuando le buscamos por encima de todas las cosas y le confiamos lo poco que poseemos, Él transforma nuestro vacío en abundancia y nuestra debilidad en bendición.

Que la Sagrada Eucaristía profundice nuestra sed de Dios, el único que sacia todo corazón humano, y que nos convirtamos en pan partido y compartido para un mundo hambriento. Amén.
