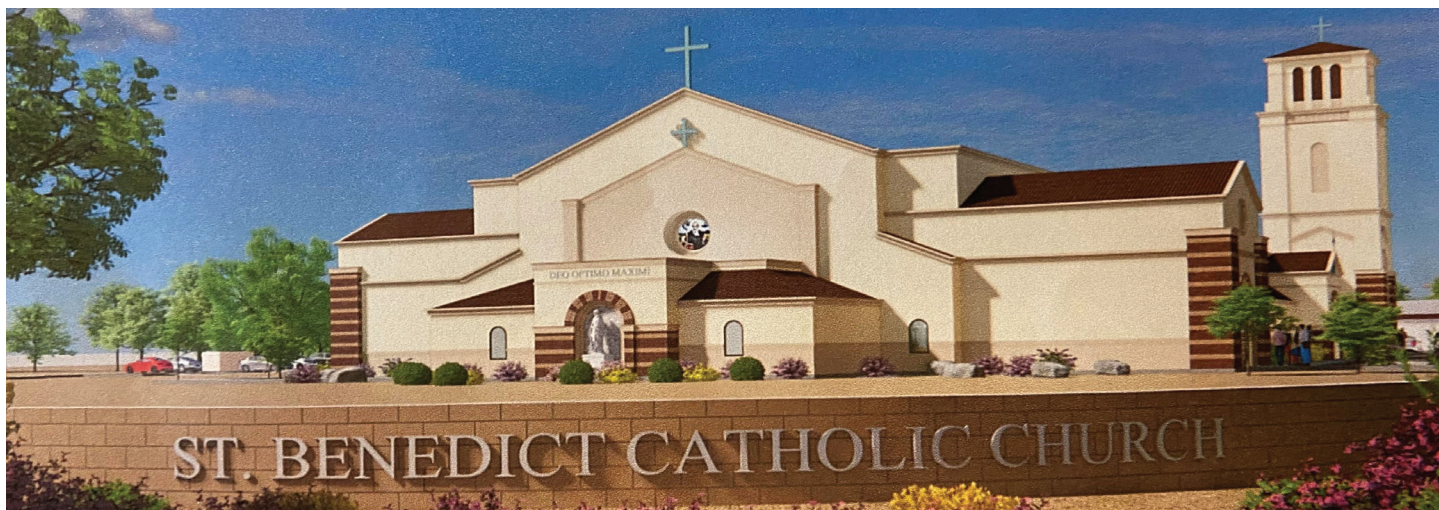

Gospel Reflection

ENCOUNTERING CHRIST THROUGH OUR CROSSES



Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

The readings today speak about one difficult but necessary reality of Christian life: following God is not always easy, but it is always worth it. Sometimes God's will leads us through sacrifice, rejection, suffering and the Cross. Yet, when we remain faithful, God brings meaning and life out of our struggles.

In the first reading, Jeremiah is frustrated because his mission has brought him suffering and rejection. He feels that God has placed him in a difficult situation. Jeremiah wants to stop preaching, but he discovers that he cannot remain silent because there is a burning fire in his heart, imprisoned in his bones that inspires him and every effort to stop is not possible. This is the experience of someone who knows that God has called him. Sometimes doing God's will can be difficult. We may experience rejection, misunderstanding, disappointment, loneliness and confrontations even as volunteers. But like Jeremiah, we discover that God's word within us is stronger than our difficulties.

In the second reading of today, St. Paul tells us: *"To offer our bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God."* Paul is reminding us that Christianity is not only about coming to church. Our whole life is an offering to God. Our work, family, relationships, suffering, talents, time, confusion, worries, disappointments and even our difficulties can become offerings to God. Paul also says: *"Do not model yourselves on the behavior of the world, but let your minds be renewed."* The world may tell us: *"Choose comfort, avoid sacrifice, seek pleasure and think only about yourself."* But Christ tells us: *"Give, serve, forgive, sacrifice and love."*

In the Gospel, Jesus tells His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, suffer, be killed and rise again. Peter does not like this idea. He takes Jesus aside and says: *"Heaven preserve you, Lord; this must not happen to you."* But Jesus responds strongly: *"Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path."* Why? Because Peter wanted a Messiah without suffering. He wanted glory without the Cross. Jesus then gives us one of the most important teachings of Christianity: *"If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me."* We all have crosses that people may never know about. We carry smiling faces but deep within are worries that weigh us down. Jesus does not say, *"If you have a cross, you are doing something wrong."* He says, *"Take up your cross and follow me."* The Cross is not the end of the story. Jesus carried the Cross and came to resurrection. A seed must fall into the ground before it produces a harvest. Some of the greatest spiritual growth in our lives can come through the difficult seasons if we give Jesus a chance.

Jesus invites us today not to abandon our mission because it becomes difficult. Jeremiah teaches us that God's call can remain powerful even when we are tired. St. Paul invites us to offer our lives to God as a living sacrifice.

Do not run away from every cross because some crosses are not obstacles to God's plan but part of God's plan. St. John Paul II says: *"When the cross is embraced it becomes a sign of love and of total self-giving. To carry it behind Christ means to be united with Him in offering the greatest proof of love."* Our Christianity is not a promise of a cross-free life; it is the promise that Christ will help us carry our crosses to make them lighter if we ask His help. He really wants us to discover Him through our difficulties. When you are tired, remember Jeremiah. When you are tempted to conform to the world, remember Paul. When the Cross becomes heavy, look at Jesus. May we have the courage to say every day: *"Lord, even when I do not understand your plan, I choose to follow you."* Amen.

Carved from wood of the sacred Olive tree, this workmanship has been a tradition for these families for hundreds of years.

It is hoped that, through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income will be able to stay living and survive in the Holy Land. Thank you in advance for your support.

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Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

ENCUENTRAR A CRISTO A TRAVÉS DE NUESTRAS CRUCES



Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Las lecturas de hoy nos hablan de una realidad difícil, pero necesaria, de la vida cristiana: seguir a Dios no siempre es fácil, pero siempre merece la pena. A veces, la voluntad de Dios nos lleva por caminos de sacrificio, rechazo, sufrimiento y la Cruz. Sin embargo, cuando nos mantenemos fieles, Dios da sentido y vida a nuestras dificultades.

En la primera lectura, Jeremías se siente frustrado porque su misión le ha acarreado sufrimiento y rechazo. Siente que Dios le ha puesto en una situación difícil. Jeremías quiere dejar de predicar, pero descubre que no puede permanecer en silencio porque hay un fuego ardiente en su corazón, encerrado en sus huesos, que le inspira, y que cualquier intento por detenerlo resulta imposible. Esta es la experiencia de alguien que sabe que Dios le ha llamado. A veces, hacer la voluntad de Dios puede resultar difícil. Podemos sufrir rechazo, incompreensión, decepción, soledad y enfrentamientos, incluso como voluntarios. Pero, al igual que Jeremías, descubrimos que la palabra de Dios que hay en nuestro interior es más fuerte que nuestras dificultades.

En la segunda lectura de hoy, san Pablo nos dice: «Ofrecer nuestros cuerpos como sacrificio vivo, santo y agradable a Dios». Pablo nos recuerda que el cristianismo no consiste únicamente en acudir a la iglesia. Toda nuestra vida es una ofrenda a Dios. Nuestro trabajo, nuestra familia, nuestras relaciones, nuestros sufrimientos, nuestros talentos, nuestro tiempo, nuestra confusión, nuestras preocupaciones, nuestras decepciones e incluso nuestras dificultades pueden convertirse en ofrendas a Dios. Pablo también dice: «No os amoldéis al comportamiento del mundo, sino renovad vuestra mente». El mundo puede decirnos: «Elegid la comodidad, evitad el sacrificio, buscad el placer y pensad solo en vosotros mismos». Pero Cristo nos dice: «Dad, servid, perdonad, sacrificaos y amad».

En el Evangelio, Jesús les dice a sus discípulos que debe ir a Jerusalén, sufrir, ser asesinado y resucitar. A Pedro no le gusta esta idea. Se lleva a Jesús a un lado y le dice: «Que Dios te libre, Señor; esto no debe sucederte». Pero Jesús le responde con firmeza: «¡Apártate de mí, Satanás! Eres un obstáculo en mi camino». ¿Por qué? Porque Pedro quería un Mesías sin sufrimiento. Quería la gloria sin la cruz. Entonces, Jesús nos da una de las enseñanzas más importantes del cristianismo: «Si alguien quiere ser mi discípulo, que renuncie a sí mismo, tome su cruz y me siga». Todos tenemos cruces que quizá nadie llegue a conocer jamás. Mostramos una cara sonriente, pero en lo más profundo de nuestro ser hay preocupaciones que nos agobian. Jesús no dice: «Si tienes una cruz, es que estás haciendo algo mal». Dice: «Toma tu cruz y sígueme». La cruz no es el final de la historia. Jesús cargó con la cruz y resucitó. Una semilla debe caer en la tierra antes de dar fruto. Algunos de los mayores avances espirituales de nuestras vidas pueden producirse precisamente en los momentos difíciles, si le damos una oportunidad a Jesús.

Jesús nos invita hoy a no abandonar nuestra misión por el hecho de que se vuelva difícil. Jeremías nos enseña que la llamada de Dios puede seguir siendo poderosa incluso cuando estamos cansados. San Pablo nos invita a ofrecer nuestras vidas a Dios como un sacrificio vivo.

No huyas de todas las cruces, porque algunas no son obstáculos para el plan de Dios, sino parte de él. San Juan Pablo II dice: «Cuando se abraza la cruz, esta se convierte en un signo de amor y de entrega total. Llevarla tras Cristo significa estar unidos a Él para ofrecer la mayor prueba de amor». Nuestra fe cristiana no es la promesa de una vida sin cruces; es la promesa de que Cristo nos ayudará a llevar nuestras cruces para aligerarlas si le pedimos su ayuda. Él realmente quiere que lo descubramos a través de nuestras dificultades. Cuando estés cansado, recuerda a Jeremías. Cuando te sientas tentado a adaptarte al mundo, recuerda a Pablo. Cuando la cruz se vuelva pesada, mira a Jesús. Que tengamos el valor de decir cada día: «Señor, aunque no entienda tu plan, elijo seguirte». Amén.

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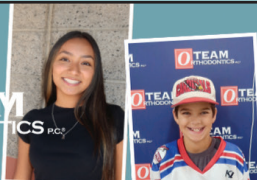
