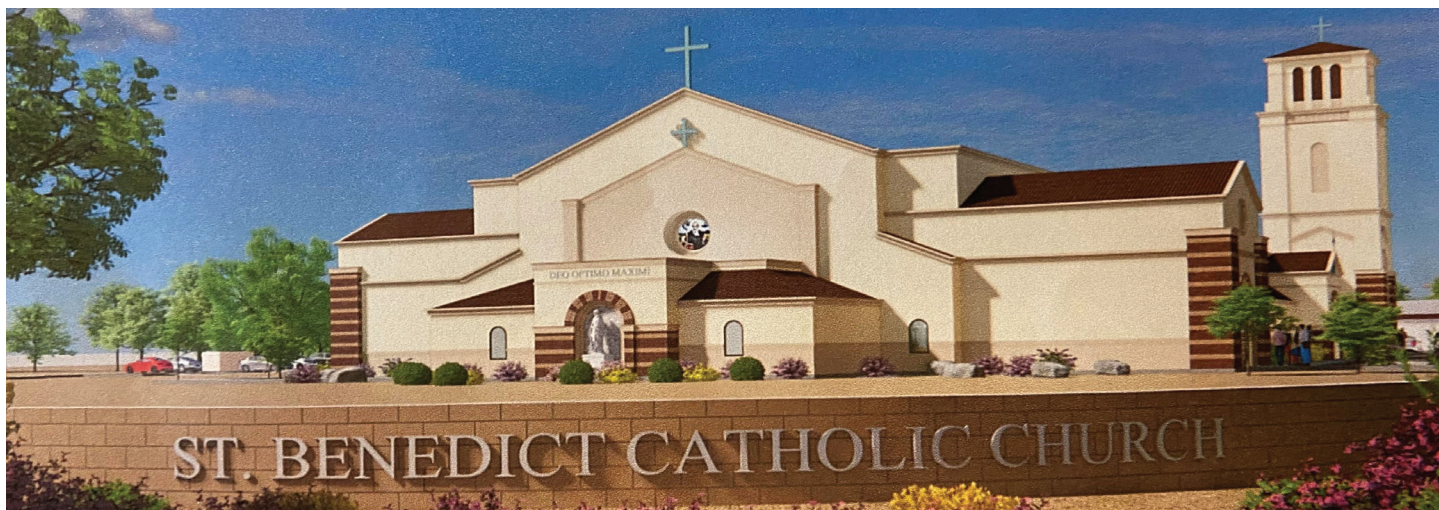

Gospel Reflection

LOVE ENOUGH TO CARE, SPEAK, CORRECT AND FORGIVE



Dear Friends in Christ,

The readings of today invite us to reflect and remember that we are not meant to live for ourselves alone, but for one another. This responsibility must always be guided by love and not by judgment, gossip, or condemnation. True Christian love cares enough to speak the truth, correct gently, forgive generously, and help one another find the right path.

In the first reading, God appoints Ezekiel as a watchman for the people of Israel. A watchman stays alert and warns others when danger is approaching. God tells Ezekiel that if he sees danger and fails to warn the people, he will be accountable for their sins. But if he faithfully warns them and they refuse to listen, he has fulfilled his responsibility. The message is clear: silence is not always love. Sometimes, when we truly love someone, we must have the courage to speak. A parent who loves a child will correct the child. A true friend will not watch a friend walk into danger without saying anything. A loving Christian should care not only about another person's physical welfare but also about their spiritual and moral well-being.

In the second reading, St. Paul gives us the key to understanding both the first reading and the Gospel: *"Owe no one anything, except to love one another."* Love is the foundation of Christian life. But genuine love is not merely being nice to people or agreeing with everything they do. True love seeks the good of the other person. Therefore, when correction is necessary, it must come from love and not in anger, pride, revenge, or the desire to embarrass someone. Before correcting others, we should ask ourselves: *"Am I speaking because I love this person, or because I want to prove that I am right?"* Pope Francis describes fraternal correction as *"one of the highest expressions of love,"* while also warning that it is one of the most demanding.

In the Gospel, Jesus gives us a beautiful process for dealing with someone who has done wrong. First, speak privately with the person. Jesus does not say: Tell everyone about the person, or post it on social media, or destroy the person's reputation. He says: Go to the person privately. Secondly Jesus invites us to seek help if necessary and if the person does not listen, take one or two others. Jesus does not say; form a group against the person. Seek understanding and reconciliation. Thirdly Jesus instructs us to involve the community only when the private and smaller efforts have failed. The goal is never to humiliate the person. The goal is to win back your brother or sister. Pope Francis calls this Jesus' pedagogy of rehabilitation: it is a process aimed at helping, restoring, and saving the person rather than publicly exposing the person. We live in a world where people often do the opposite of what Jesus teaches. Instead of speaking to people, we speak about them. Instead of correcting privately, we expose them publicly. Instead of seeking reconciliation, we seek revenge. Instead of healing wounds, we spread gossip. Social media has made this even more common. One mistake can become public entertainment. But Jesus teaches us to have a conversation privately, truthfully, gently, and lovingly.

Pope Francis strongly warns that gossip damages both individuals and communities and never truly helps people improve. Care about the good of others. Sometimes love requires courage. Do not expose someone's weakness before speaking to them personally. Before correcting someone, remember that you too are a sinner who needs mercy and forgiveness. Never correct from anger. Correction without love can become cruelty. The purpose must always be healing and restoration. Avoid gossip, build unity through prayer. When a community prays, forgives, listens, and seeks reconciliation Christ is present with them. Pope Francis reminds us that *"Fraternal correction is one of the highest expressions of love, and also one of the most demanding."* St. Thomas Aquinas teaches that fraternal correction is fundamentally an act of charity, and therefore should be carried out with gentleness, respect, and concern for the good of the other person. Always be reminded that if we love, we care. If we care, sometimes we must speak. But we must always speak with humility, truth, gentleness, and love. Be courageous to speak privately, forgive generously, correct lovingly, and pray sincerely. May the Lord help us to become watchmen like Ezekiel, lovers like St. Paul teaches, and compassionate brothers and sisters like Jesus commands us to be. Amen.

FAQ: Why Should I Register at Saint Benedict Catholic Church?

1. A sense of belonging and identity within the parish community.
2. It is a commitment to practice your faith.
3. Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you, in good times and in bad.
4. Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will have a statement for income tax purposes.
5. Registered, active members are eligible to be sacramental sponsors and Godparents.
6. Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.
7. Children are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. Once they are 18, it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and register as a member independent of their parents.

Registration forms can be also be found in the parish Narthex at the back of the church. Submit your completed form to the parish office, drop it in the collection basket or the office drop box located outside the office window.

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

AMAR LO SUFICIENTE COMO PARA PREOCUPARSE, HABLAR, CORREGIR Y PERDONAR



Queridos amigos en Cristo,

Las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a reflexionar y a recordar que no estamos destinados a vivir solo para nosotros mismos, sino los unos para los otros. Esta responsabilidad debe estar siempre guiada por el amor y no por el juicio, el chisme o la condena. El verdadero amor cristiano nos mueve a decir la verdad, a corregir con delicadeza, a perdonar con generosidad y a ayudarnos mutuamente a encontrar el camino correcto.

En la primera lectura, Dios nombra a Ezequiel centinela del pueblo de Israel. Un centinela permanece alerta y advierte a los demás cuando se avecina el peligro. Dios le dice a Ezequiel que, si ve el peligro y no advierte al pueblo, será responsable de sus pecados. Pero si les advierte fielmente y ellos se niegan a escuchar, habrá cumplido con su responsabilidad. El mensaje es claro: el silencio no siempre es sinónimo de amor. A veces, cuando amamos de verdad a alguien, debemos tener el valor de hablar. Un padre que ama a su hijo lo corregirá. Un verdadero amigo no se quedará de brazos cruzados viendo cómo su amigo se expone al peligro sin decir nada. Un cristiano amoroso debe preocuparse no solo por el bienestar físico de los demás, sino también por su bienestar espiritual y moral.

En la segunda lectura, san Pablo nos da la clave para comprender tanto la primera lectura como el Evangelio: «No debáis nada a nadie, salvo el amor mutuo». El amor es el fundamento de la vida cristiana. Pero el amor auténtico no consiste simplemente en ser amable con los demás o estar de acuerdo con todo lo que hacen. El verdadero amor busca el bien del otro. Por lo tanto, cuando es necesaria una corrección, debe partir del amor y no de la ira, el orgullo, la venganza o el deseo de avergonzar a alguien. Antes de corregir a los demás, deberíamos preguntarnos: «¿Estoy hablando porque quiero a esta persona o porque quiero demostrar que tengo razón?». El papa Francisco describe la corrección fraterna como «una de las expresiones más elevadas del amor», al tiempo que advierte de que es una de las más exigentes.

En el Evangelio, Jesús nos ofrece un hermoso proceso para tratar con alguien que ha actuado mal. En primer lugar, habla en privado con esa persona. Jesús no dice: «Cuéntaselo a todo el mundo», ni «públícalo en las redes sociales», ni «destruye la reputación de esa persona». Él dice: «Acércate a esa persona en privado». En segundo lugar, Jesús nos invita a buscar ayuda si es necesario y, si la persona no te escucha, a llevar contigo a una o dos personas más. Jesús no dice: «Formad un grupo en contra de esa persona». Buscad el entendimiento y la reconciliación. En tercer lugar, Jesús nos enseña a recurrir a la comunidad solo cuando los esfuerzos privados y a menor escala hayan fracasado. El objetivo nunca es humillar a la persona. El objetivo es recuperar a tu hermano o hermana. El papa Francisco llama a esto la «pedagogía de la rehabilitación» de Jesús: es un proceso destinado a ayudar, restaurar y salvar a la persona, en lugar de exponerla públicamente. Vivimos en un mundo en el que la gente suele hacer lo contrario de lo que enseña Jesús. En lugar de hablar con las personas, hablamos de ellas. En lugar de corregir en privado, los exponemos públicamente. En lugar de buscar la reconciliación, buscamos venganza. En lugar de curar las heridas, difundimos chismes. Las redes sociales han hecho que esto sea aún más habitual. Un solo error puede convertirse en un espectáculo público. Pero Jesús nos enseña a hablar en privado, con sinceridad, amabilidad y amor.

El papa Francisco advierte con firmeza que los chismes perjudican tanto a las personas como a las comunidades y nunca ayudan realmente a que la gente mejore. Preocúpate por el bien de los demás. A veces, el amor requiere valor. No saques a relucir las debilidades de alguien antes de hablar con él o ella personalmente. Antes de corregir a alguien, recuerda que tú también eres un pecador que necesita misericordia y perdón. Nunca corrijas movido por la ira. La corrección sin amor puede convertirse en crueldad. El objetivo debe ser siempre la sanación y la restauración. Evita los chismes, fomenta la unidad a través de la oración. Cuando una comunidad reza, perdona, escucha y busca la reconciliación, Cristo está presente entre ellos. El papa Francisco nos recuerda que «la corrección fraterna es una de las expresiones más elevadas del amor, y también una de las más exigentes». Santo Tomás de Aquino enseña que la corrección fraterna es, fundamentalmente, un acto de caridad y, por lo tanto, debe llevarse a cabo con delicadeza, respeto y preocupación por el bien de la otra persona. Recordad siempre que, si amamos, nos preocupamos. Y si nos preocupamos, a veces debemos hablar. Pero siempre debemos hablar con humildad, verdad, amabilidad y amor. Tened el valor de hablar en privado, perdonad con generosidad, corregid con amor y orad con sinceridad. Que el Señor nos ayude a convertirnos en centinelas como Ezequiel, en personas que aman tal y como enseña san Pablo, y en hermanos y hermanas compasivos, tal y como Jesús nos manda ser. Amén.

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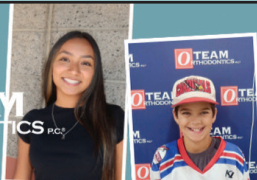
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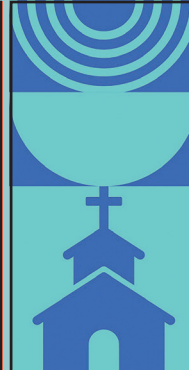
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A Note From The SJB Principal
