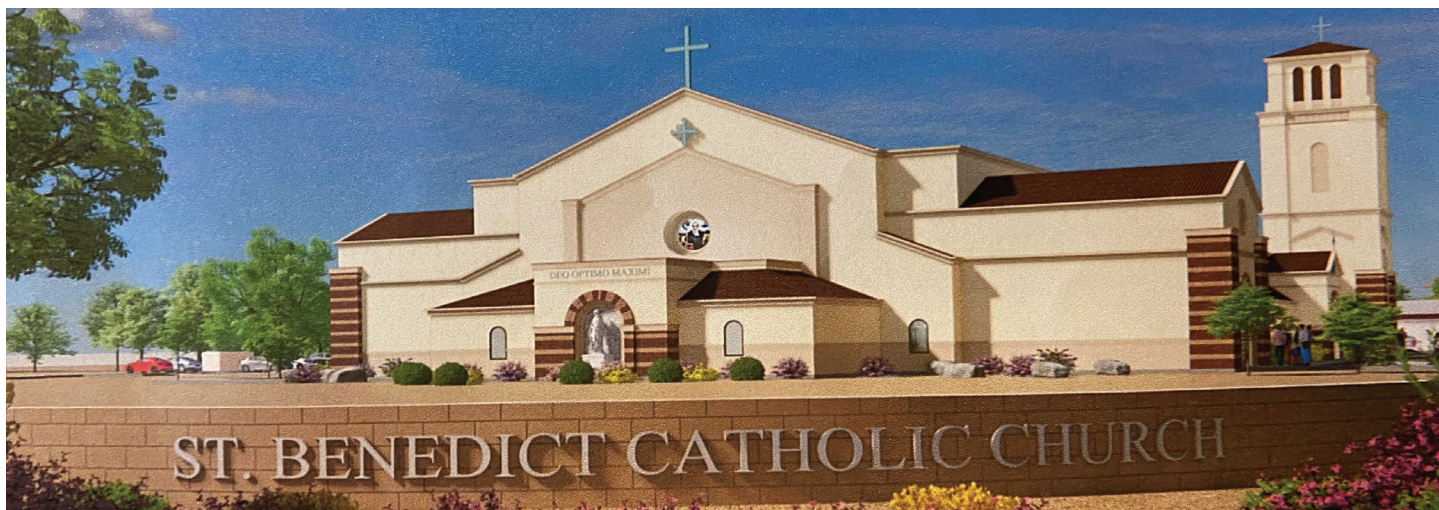

Gospel Reflection

LET GO OF ANGER AND RESENTMENT AND MAKE FORGIVENESS A WAY OF LIFE



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There are wounds that medicine cannot heal and debts that money cannot repay. Some of the deepest wounds are caused by words, betrayal, rejection, injustice, or the failure of someone we trusted. And sometimes the hardest prayer is not *"Lord, bless me,"* but *"Lord, give me the grace to forgive."* The readings today place forgiveness at the centre of Christian life. They remind us that we are people who have received mercy from God, and therefore we must become people who extend mercy to others.

Sirach speaks in the first reading very directly: *"Wrath and anger are hateful things, yet the sinner hugs them tight."* The author asks: How can we expect God to forgive us if we refuse to forgive our brother or sister? This is a profound lesson. Resentment often hurts the person carrying it more than the person who caused the hurt. When we refuse to forgive, we allow yesterday's injury to continue controlling today's life. Sirach is not saying that what happened was insignificant. Forgiveness does not mean pretending that an injustice never happened. Rather, it means refusing to allow injustice to possess our hearts forever.

St. Paul tells us in the second reading that: *"Whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's."* This is important for forgiveness because Paul reminds us that our lives do not belong to ourselves alone. If I belong to Jesus, then my relationships must also be shaped by Jesus. I cannot say, *"I belong to Jesus,"* while deliberately allowing hatred, bitterness and revenge to rule my heart. Christ died and rose so that we might live differently. Our identity is no longer defined by the person who hurt us. We belong to the Lord.

In the Gospel reading, Peter asks how many times he must forgive, thinking seven times is generous, but Jesus says, *"seventy-seven times."* Jesus teaches that forgiveness has no limit.

The unforgiving servant shows the contradiction of receiving God's great mercy while refusing to show mercy to others. We ask God to forgive us generously, but sometimes we forgive others very reluctantly. Pope Francis reflected on this very point, saying that the parable teaches us that *"just as God has forgiven us, so we too should forgive those who do us harm."* All three readings of today leads us to one central truth: A person who has truly experienced God's mercy cannot remain permanently imprisoned by resentment. God's mercy received must become mercy given. The Gospel makes us to understand that someone must be courageous enough to say: *"The hurt stops with me. I will not pass this hatred to my children. I will not repay evil with evil. With God's grace, I will forgive."* That is Christian maturity. But does forgiveness mean allowing people to hurt us again? No. Forgiveness does not mean approving evil. It does not mean refusing justice. It does not mean remaining in an abusive or dangerous situation. It does not mean that there should be no consequences for wrongdoing. Forgiveness means that we surrender vengeance to God and refuse to allow hatred to govern our hearts. Sometimes forgiveness also requires boundaries, distance, justice and healing. Always remember how much God has forgiven you, do not make your heart a warehouse of old wounds. Forgive because you are forgiven, we do not forgive because the other person deserves it. We forgive because Christ has shown us mercy. The Cross is the greatest proof of this. Jesus did not respond to humanity's sin with revenge. He responded with mercy. Pope Leo XIV teaches that Christian forgiveness does not mean ignoring injustice. Rather, forgiveness transforms the way we seek justice. He says that evil must not simply be punished; it must also be repaired, with attention to the good of persons and the common good. Pope Francis emphasized that forgiveness is difficult, but when we cannot forgive on our own, we can ask God for the strength to forgive. You may not be able to change what happened, but you can be healed of the wounds of pain and unforgiveness.

Forgiveness is not weakness. Forgiveness is freedom, it places our wounded heart back into the hands of God. May God grant us the grace to forgive and be healed of our hurts. And may He teach us to forgive as He forgave us. Amen.

Ayman represents Christian families from the Holy Land who make these items. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand-carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land; however, due to the war and conflict in the Middle East tourism has dwindled.

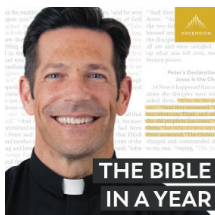

FAQ: Why Should I Register at Saint Benedict Catholic Church?

1. A sense of belonging and identity within the parish community.
2. It is a commitment to practice your faith.
3. Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you, in good times and in bad.
4. Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will have a statement for income tax purposes.
5. Registered, active members are eligible to be sacramental sponsors and Godparents.
6. Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.
7. Children are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. Once they are 18, it is their responsibility to join a church family, participate in the Mass and register as a member independent of their parents.

Registration forms can be also be found in the parish Narthex at the back of the church. Submit your completed form to the parish office, drop it in the collection basket or the office drop box located outside the office window.

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

DEJA A UN LADO LA IRA Y EL RESENTIMIENTO Y HAZ DEL PERDÓN UNA FORMA DE VIDA



Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Hay heridas que la medicina no puede curar y deudas que el dinero no puede saldar. Algunas de las heridas más profundas las causan las palabras, la traición, el rechazo, la injusticia o el fracaso de alguien en quien confiábamos. Y, a veces, la oración más difícil no es «Señor, bendíceme», sino «Señor, dame la gracia de perdonar». Las lecturas de hoy sitúan el perdón en el centro de la vida cristiana. Nos recuerdan que somos personas que hemos recibido la misericordia de Dios y que, por lo tanto, debemos convertirnos en personas que ofrezcan misericordia a los demás.

En la primera lectura, el Eclesiástico se expresa de forma muy directa: «La ira y el enojo son cosas detestables, pero el pecador se aferra a ellas con fuerza». El autor pregunta: ¿Cómo podemos esperar que Dios nos perdone si nos negamos a perdonar a nuestro hermano o hermana? Esta es una lección profunda. El resentimiento suele hacer más daño a quien lo alberga que a quien causó el daño. Cuando nos negamos a perdonar, permitimos que el daño del pasado siga controlando nuestra vida actual. El Eclesiástico no está diciendo que lo que ocurrió fuera insignificante. Perdonar no significa fingir que nunca se cometió una injusticia. Más bien, significa negarnos a permitir que la injusticia se apodere de nuestros corazones para siempre.

San Pablo nos dice en la segunda lectura que: «Ya vivamos, ya muramos, somos del Señor». Esto es importante para el perdón, porque Pablo nos recuerda que nuestras vidas no nos pertenecen solo a nosotros. Si pertenezco a Jesús, entonces mis relaciones también deben estar moldeadas por Jesús. No puedo decir «pertenecesco a Jesús» mientras permita deliberadamente que el odio, el rencor y la venganza dominen mi corazón. Cristo murió y resucitó para que pudiéramos vivir de otra manera. Nuestra identidad ya no viene definida por la persona que nos ha hecho daño. Pertenecemos al Señor.

En la lectura del Evangelio, Pedro pregunta cuántas veces debe perdonar, pensando que siete veces es generoso, pero Jesús le responde: «setenta y siete veces». Jesús nos enseña que el perdón no tiene límites.

El siervo implacable pone de manifiesto la contradicción que supone recibir la gran misericordia de Dios y, al mismo tiempo, negarse a mostrar misericordia hacia los demás. Le pedimos a Dios que nos perdone generosamente, pero a veces perdonamos a los demás muy a regañadientes. El papa Francisco reflexionó precisamente sobre este punto y afirmó que la parábola nos enseña que «así como Dios nos ha perdonado, también nosotros debemos perdonar a quienes nos hacen daño». Las tres lecturas de hoy nos llevan a una verdad fundamental: quien ha experimentado verdaderamente la misericordia de Dios no puede permanecer cautivo para siempre del resentimiento. La misericordia de Dios recibida debe convertirse en misericordia concedida. El Evangelio nos hace comprender que alguien debe tener el valor suficiente para decir: «El dolor se detiene en mí. No transmitiré este odio a mis hijos. No devolveré el mal con el mal. Con la gracia de Dios, perdonaré». Eso es la madurez cristiana. Pero, ¿significa el perdón permitir que la gente nos vuelva a hacer daño? No. El perdón no significa aprobar el mal. No significa renunciar a la justicia. No significa permanecer en una situación de maltrato o peligrosa. No significa que no deba haber consecuencias por las malas acciones. El perdón significa que entregamos la venganza a Dios y nos negamos a permitir que el odio gobierne nuestros corazones. A veces, el perdón también requiere límites, distancia, justicia y sanación. Recuerda siempre cuánto te ha perdonado Dios; no conviertas tu corazón en un almacén de viejas heridas. Perdona porque has sido perdonado; no perdonamos porque la otra persona se lo merezca. Perdonamos porque Cristo nos ha mostrado misericordia. La Cruz es la mayor prueba de ello. Jesús no respondió al pecado de la humanidad con venganza. Respondió con misericordia. El papa León XIV enseña que el perdón cristiano no significa ignorar la injusticia. Más bien, el perdón transforma la forma en que buscamos la justicia. Afirma que el mal no debe limitarse a ser castigado, sino que también debe repararse, prestando atención al bien de las personas y al bien común. El papa Francisco ha subrayado que perdonar es difícil, pero que, cuando no somos capaces de perdonar por nosotros mismos, podemos pedirle a Dios la fuerza para hacerlo. Puede que no puedas cambiar lo que ha pasado, pero sí puedes sanar las heridas causadas por el dolor y la falta de perdón.

El perdón no es debilidad. El perdón es libertad; devuelve nuestro corazón herido a las manos de Dios. Que Dios nos conceda la gracia de perdonar y de sanar nuestras heridas. Y que Él nos enseñe a perdonar tal y como Él nos ha perdonado. Amén.
