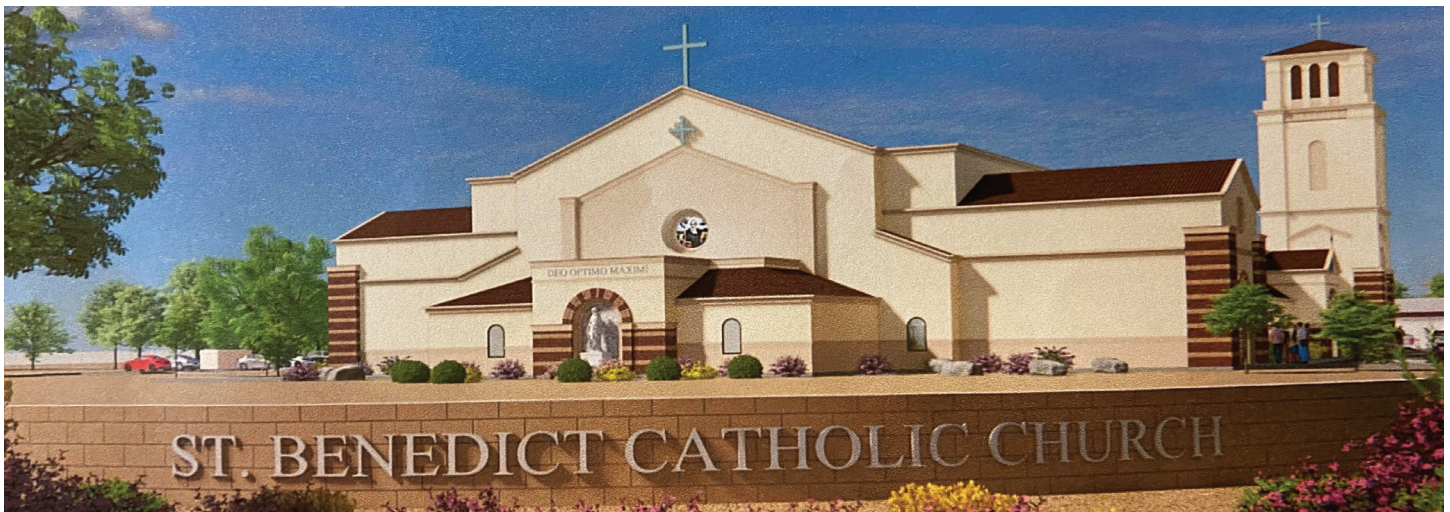

Gospel Reflection

GOD'S WAYS ARE NOT OUR WAYS AND HIS THOUGHTS ARE NOT OUR THOUGHTS



Dear Friends In Christ,

Sometimes we look at our lives and ask, *"Lord, why does another person seem to receive what I have been praying for?"* Sometimes we forget that God's love is not something we earn or compete for; His grace is a gift freely given to His children. The First Reading from Isaiah 55:6-9 gives us the foundation for understanding today's Gospel: *"Seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near."* Isaiah calls us to conversion to turn away from sin and return to God with a sincere heart. He reminds us that *"God's thoughts are not your thoughts, and His ways are not our ways."* We often judge people according to their past or what we think they deserve, but God looks at the heart and offers mercy to the repentant sinner. This is one of the beautiful truths of our Catholic faith: no one is beyond God's mercy when there is genuine repentance. The Sacrament of Reconciliation reminds us that when we return to God, He does not treat us as rejected people but welcomes us as beloved children. Therefore, never allow your past to convince you that God has stopped calling you. It is never too late to seek the Lord, and it is never too late for grace to begin something new in our lives.

The Second Reading from Philippians 1:20-24, 27 shows us how we should live after receiving God's grace. St. Paul says: *"For to me life is Christ, and death is gain."* For Paul, Christ is not simply part of his life; Christ is the center and meaning of his life. Whether he lives or dies, his desire is to glorify Christ and serve His people. This teaches us that Christian life is not simply about asking, *"What am I receiving from God?"* but also, *"What am I giving to God and to others?"* Our different vocations of marriage, priesthood, religious life, single life, family, work and service are different ways of responding to God's call. What matters is not that one vocation looks greater than another, but that we are faithful to the grace God has entrusted to us. Paul therefore asks Christians to live *"in a manner worthy of the Gospel."* Our faith must become visible in forgiveness, charity, patience, sacrifice and service. When Christ is truly at the center, we become less concerned with comparing ourselves with others and more concerned with becoming faithful disciples. The Christian does not ask, *"Am I doing more than the other person?"* but, *"Am I doing what Jesus is asking of me?"*

The Gospel from Matthew 20:1-16a brings the message of Isaiah and Paul together through the parable of the workers in the vineyard. The vineyard can remind us of God's Kingdom and the Church, where the Lord continually calls people to serve Him. Some are called early in life, while others discover God much later; some have served faithfully for many years, while others return to God after years of wandering. Yet God's invitation remains open. The workers who came early became unhappy when those who came later received the same wage. Their deeper problem was comparison and envy: they looked at what others received instead of being grateful for what they had received themselves. The landowner asks, *"Are you envious because I am generous?"* Another person's blessing does not reduce God's love for us; another person's conversion does not take away our place in God's Kingdom. In the Church, we are not competitors but members of one Body of Christ. This is why Pope Leo XIV's call for *"the gift to listen, and the gift to be humble, and the gift to promote unity"* is so important. Humility teaches us to accept that God's ways are greater than ours, while charity teaches us to rejoice when another person is blessed. The Gospel therefore invites us to move from comparison to gratitude, from entitlement to grace, and from jealousy to love.

Let us remember: God's generosity toward another person is not a loss for us. We may not always understand God's plan, but we can trust His wisdom, His mercy and His heart. May the Lord bless his words in our hearts, Amen.

Reflexión sobre las Escrituras

LOS CAMINOS DE DIOS NO SON NUESTROS CAMINOS Y SUS PENSAMIENTOS NO SON NUESTROS PENSAMIENTOS



Queridos amigos en Cristo,

A veces miramos nuestras vidas y nos preguntamos: «Señor, ¿por qué parece que otra persona recibe aquello por lo que yo he estado rezando?». A veces olvidamos que el amor de Dios no es algo que nos ganemos ni por lo que compitamos; su gracia es un don que concede gratuitamente a sus hijos. La primera lectura, tomada de Isaías 55, 6-9, nos ofrece la base para comprender el Evangelio de hoy: «Buscad al Señor mientras puede ser hallado; invocadlo mientras está cerca». Isaías nos llama a la conversión, a apartarnos del pecado y volver a Dios con un corazón sincero. Nos recuerda que «los pensamientos de Dios no son vuestros pensamientos, ni sus caminos son nuestros caminos». A menudo juzgamos a las personas según su pasado o según lo que creemos que se merecen, pero Dios mira el corazón y ofrece misericordia al pecador arrepentido. Esta es una de las hermosas verdades de nuestra fe católica: nadie está fuera del alcance de la misericordia de Dios cuando hay un arrepentimiento sincero. El sacramento de la Reconciliación nos recuerda que, cuando volvemos a Dios, Él no nos trata como a personas rechazadas, sino que nos acoge como a hijos amados. Por eso, no permitas nunca que tu pasado te convenza de que Dios ha dejado de llamarte. Nunca es demasiado tarde para buscar al Señor, y nunca es demasiado tarde para que la gracia comience algo nuevo en nuestras vidas.

La segunda lectura, tomada de Filipenses 1, 20-24 y 27, nos muestra cómo debemos vivir tras haber recibido la gracia de Dios. San Pablo dice: «Para mí, la vida es Cristo, y la muerte es ganancia». Para Pablo, Cristo no es simplemente una parte de su vida; Cristo es el centro y el sentido de su vida. Tanto si vive como si muere, su deseo es glorificar a Cristo y servir a su pueblo. Esto nos enseña que la vida cristiana no consiste simplemente en preguntarnos: «¿Qué recibo de Dios?», sino también: «¿Qué le doy a Dios y a los demás?». Nuestras diferentes vocaciones —el matrimonio, el sacerdocio, la vida religiosa, la vida de soltero, la familia, el trabajo y el servicio— son distintas formas de responder a la llamada de Dios. Lo importante no es que una vocación parezca más grande que otra, sino que seamos fieles a la gracia que Dios nos ha confiado. Por eso, Pablo pide a los cristianos que vivan «de manera digna del Evangelio». Nuestra fe debe hacerse visible en el perdón, la caridad, la paciencia, el sacrificio y el servicio. Cuando Cristo ocupa verdaderamente el centro, nos preocupamos menos por compararnos con los demás y más por convertirnos en discípulos fieles. El cristiano no se pregunta: «¿Estoy haciendo más que la otra persona?», sino: «¿Estoy haciendo lo que Jesús me pide?».

El Evangelio según San Mateo 20, 1-16a une el mensaje de Isaías y de Pablo a través de la parábola de los trabajadores de la viña. La viña puede recordarnos el Reino de Dios y la Iglesia, donde el Señor llama continuamente a las personas a servirle. Algunos son llamados desde muy jóvenes, mientras que otros descubren a Dios mucho más tarde; algunos han servido fielmente durante muchos años, mientras que otros vuelven a Dios tras años de vagar. Sin embargo, la invitación de Dios sigue abierta. Los trabajadores que llegaron temprano se enfadaron cuando los que llegaron más tarde recibieron el mismo salario. Su problema más profundo era la comparación y la envidia: se fijaban en lo que recibían los demás en lugar de estar agradecidos por lo que ellos mismos habían recibido. El terrateniente pregunta: «¿Tenéis envidia porque soy generoso?». La bendición de otra persona no disminuye el amor de Dios por nosotros; la conversión de otra persona no nos quita nuestro lugar en el Reino de Dios. En la Iglesia, no somos competidores, sino miembros de un mismo Cuerpo de Cristo. Por eso es tan importante el llamamiento del papa León XIV al «don de saber escuchar, al don de la humildad y al don de promover la unidad». La humildad nos enseña a aceptar que los caminos de Dios son más grandes que los nuestros, mientras que la caridad nos enseña a alegrarnos cuando otra persona es bendecida. El Evangelio nos invita, por tanto, a pasar de la comparación a la gratitud, del sentido de derecho a la gracia, y de los celos al amor.

Recordemos: la generosidad de Dios hacia otra persona no supone una pérdida para nosotros. Puede que no siempre entendamos el plan de Dios, pero podemos confiar en su sabiduría, su misericordia y su corazón. Que el Señor bendiga sus palabras en nuestros corazones. Amén.

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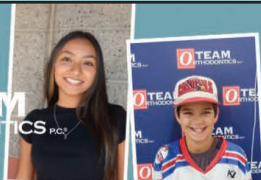
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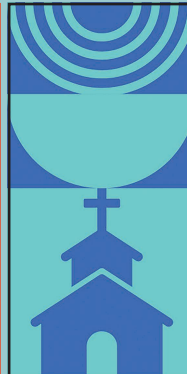
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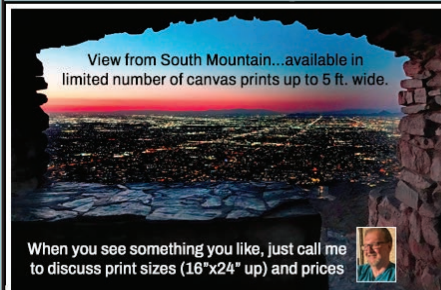
